Ladies Melville Toyota League vs UWA (Lost 0 - 1) 2016-05-07 Round 3 saw Melville up against the strong and consistent UWA outfit, who are known for their physicality all over the pitch. The game began at quite an intense pace, with both teams trying to move the ball quickly to negate each others aggressive presses. From this, UWA were able to earn a penalty corner, which was well executed by Shelley Liddelow, and gave UWA a 1-0 lead after 8 minutes. Despite the early goal, Melville girls continued to work themselves into the game and match UWA for effort and skill. With the midfield from each team working hard to set their strikers up for some goal scoring opportunities, it was UWA who were getting on top of Melville, and earned numerous short corners. Once again, Erin Judd, Melville's goalkeeper, was equal to the challenge. keeping the ball out and the score at 1-0 going in to half time. Early in the second half, it was evident that neither team would give up. Unfortunately for Melville, the experience of the UWA team started to come in to play, as they were able to control the game a bit better than the youthful and energetic Melville girls. This gave UWA more scoring opportunities from both field play, and penalty corners, where as Melville seemed to struggle to continue their good play from the midfield into the attacking circle. To Melville's credit, they defended with plenty of guts, and did not allow UWA to score again, however they could not apply the same amount of pressure to the UWA defence.

Another close 1-0 defeat for the Melville girls, however the effort and intensity was there. Round 4 sees them take on Old Aquinians away from home, with the girls looking to notch their first win of the season.

Round 4 of the Melville Toyota League saw Melville Women coming up against Old Aquinians, at the Aquinas Turf. Coach, Mal Cowan, alerted the team to the fact that in the past two weeks, the opposition had scored against them in the first 3 minutes and 8 minutes respectively. Despite asking the girls to start playing from the get go, some loose defensive work gave Aquinas striker Savannah Fitzpatrick enough room to slot the first goal of the match after 6 minutes. To make it even worse, 4 minutes later, Reds netted another goal to take a 2-0 lead.

This seemed to be the catalyst for Melville to pick up their work rate, intensity and skill level. They began to work themselves back into the contest with some hard running off the ball by the strikers, and the defenders being able to hold possession and string a few passes together. It wasn't all easy going, as they had to see off a couple of penalty corners from Reds. However, up the other end, Melville were also kept scoreless, despite having a couple of penalty corners.

Half time at 2-0 down, and Cowan instructed the girls to continue sticking with the game plan, and more opportunities would be created. This turned out to be good advice, as Melville began to create havoc amongst the Aquinas defence. Multiple penalty corners were awarded, but again Melville could not convert. With 17 minutes remaining, the strikers withstood many stick checks and questionable tackles to earn a penalty stroke, which was converted by Mathilda Carmichael.

The final 15 minutes was dominated by Melville, but the Old Aquinians goalkeeper made a few critical saves, which meant they maintained their 1 goal lead, until the final 2 minutes. Melville finally were able to convert from penalty corner, bringing the score to 2-2. Neither team were overly happy coming away with only 1 point, however, it's a step in the right direction for Melville, as they look towards their next match against Vic Park, at Duracraft Stadium, Saturday 21st May, 630pm.


